effects of test for english majors tem on program administrators teachers and students shedding new light on tem reform and the reform of english teaching and learning in china tem a nationwide test used to measure the language proficiency of undergraduate english majors in china is a major standardized test taken by nearly 400 000 students every year the book s key features include an in depth discussion of the nature of washback and a framework for investigating it a multi method and multi phase approach employing both the quantitative method of questionnaire surveys and the qualitative methods of interviews and classroom observations large scale questionnaire surveys conducted among experts program administrators teachers and students and involving over 30 000 participants detailed assessments of tem s washback effects on stakeholders perceptions classroom teaching practice students learning activities etc and essential insights into testing and teaching reforms

as the united states continues to be a nation of immigrants and their children the nation s school systems face increased enrollments of students whose primary language is not english with the 2001 reauthorization of the elementary and secondary education act esea in the no child left behind act nclb the allocation of federal funds for programs to assist these students to be proficient in english became formula based 80 percent on the basis of the population of children with limited english proficiency¹ and 20 percent on the basis of the population of recently immigrated children and youth title iii of nclb directs the u s department of education to allocate funds on the basis of the more accurate of two allowable data sources the number of students reported to the federal government by each state education agency or data from the american community survey acs the department determined that the acs estimates are more accurate and since 2005 those data have been basis for the federal distribution of title iii funds subsequently analyses of the two data sources have raised concerns about that decision especially because the two allowable data sources would allocate quite different amounts to the states in addition while shortcomings were noted in the data provided by the states the acs estimates were shown to fluctuate between years causing concern among the states about the unpredictability and unevenness of program funding in this context the u s department of education commissioned the national research council to address the accuracy of the estimates from

the two data sources and the factors that influence the estimates the resulting book also considers means of increasing the accuracy of the data sources or alternative data sources that could be used for allocation purposes

the study endeavors a detailed and systematic classification of linguistic simultaneity expressions further it aims at a well described survey of how simultaneity is expressed by native speakers in their own language on the basis of real production data the book answers the questions of how native speakers express temporal simultaneity in general and how learners at different levels of proficiency deal with this situation under experimental test conditions furthermore the results of this study shed new light on our understanding of aspect in general and on its acquisition by adult learners

the oldest and most renowned dutch university leiden was an attractive proposition for travelling foreign students in the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries alongside offering an excellent academic program and outstanding facilities leiden was also able to cater to the desires of noble students providing various extra curricular activities leiden was the most popular continental university among english students and this book investigates the 831 english students who studied there between 1575 and 1650 the preference of english students for leiden was on the one hand related to close anglo dutch relations of the period and these are investigated with respect to politics economy religion culture as well as to the large stranger communities residing in the respective countries on the other hand leiden s attraction resulted from its academic achievements which are traced back to the conditions in the united provinces the limited influence of the calvinist church leiden s professors as well as the university s facilities the core of this study is an exhaustive quantitative study of the composition of the leiden student population in general and that of its english segment in particular information is provided on the duration of the studies of english students at leiden their age social background and fields of study we learn about the careers of english students both prior to and after their time at leiden and of the motivation that led the english to choose leiden over other continental universities more than a study of one group of students at one university this book is a valuable contribution to the history of early modern universities and will appeal to a wide international readership interested in cultural and intellectual history as well as in anglo dutch relations

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
