this volume consists of fourteen essays in honor of daniel devereux on the themes of love friendship and wisdom in plato aristotle and the epicureans philia friendship and eros love are topics of major philosophical interest in ancient greek philosophy they are also topics of growing interest and importance in contemporary philosophy much of which is inspired by ancient discussions philosophy is itself of course a special sort of love viz the love of wisdom

loving in the right way is very closely connected to doing philosophy cultivating wisdom and living well the first nine essays run the gamut of plato s philosophical career they include discussions of the *alcibiadeseuthydemusgorgiasphaedophaedrus* *symposium* *nicomachean ethics* *politics* *protrepticus* *magna moralia*

friendship was recognized as a central moral value in the classical period but it was dismissed from medieval modern and twentieth century moral theories this book argues that this dismissal is unjustifiable the validity of this claim is established in four steps first it proposes the concept of moral paradigm this concept enables us to explore the source of moral value and to provide a criterion for the evaluation of the adequacy of moral theory second the book explains why medieval modern and twentieth century moral theorists neglected friendship as a central moral value in their analysis of moral behavior and why this neglect was unjustifiable third it explains why the classical moral philosophers viewed friendship as a central moral value fourth it argues that friendship is an ontological need therefore a necessary condition of the moral life this need is implicitly recognized in the moral paradigms that underlie the moral theories of the medieval modern and twentieth century moral theories accordingly it cannot be neglected in the process of moral theorizing

the eminent philosopher pays homage to his beloved french city and the philosophical friendships he had there an illuminating addition to his legacy the times literary supplement a towering figure in twentieth century philosophy jacques derrida was born in algeria but spent four decades living in the french city of strasbourg located on the border between france and germany this moving collection of writings and interviews about his life there opens with the place name s strasbourg an essay written just a month before his death which recounts his deep attachment to his adoptive home more than just a personal narrative however the essay is a profound interrogation of the relationship between philosophy and place philosophy and language and philosophy and friendship as such it raises a series of philosophical political and ethical questions that might all be placed under the aegis of what derrida once called philosophical nationalities and nationalism also included are transcribed conversations between derrida and his two principal interlocutors in strasbourg jean luc nancy and philippe lacoue labarthe these interviews are significant for the themes they focus on from language and politics to friendship and life after death and for what they reveal about derrida s relationships to

nancy and lacoue labarthe filled with sharp insights into one another s work and peppered with personal anecdotes and humor the interviews bear witness to the long intellectual friendships of these three important thinkers

25 years after the publication of derrida s politics of friendship *politiques de l amitie* 1994 this edited collection gathers 23 critical chapters that revisit this underappreciated text engaging closely with derrida s text the contributors analyse extend and critique the work they reconsider the place this book occupies in derrida s political philosophy and its potential for contemporary politics when the promises and perils of political friendship have reappeared
